Happy Spring! We are in the middle of the track and field season and are moving towards the Championship months of May and June. Congratulations and thank you to all you have participated whether they be the big meets like the West Coast Relays, Stanford Invitational, Brutus Hamilton, Fanelli Invite, Hornet Invite or even the Sturgeon Invitational as well as all of the dual, tri and quad High School and Middle School meets and USATF Youth Meets.

**Run Jump Throw** A belated thanks to all of those officials who participated in the Run Jump and Throw Youth Skills Clinic in February. Although at a new venue, American River College, our Officials showed up in force and were able to help conduct the clinic well. Special thanks to Tori Busto for organizing the Clinic. We hope next year that the clinic will be larger and with increased attendance. We hope for 300 kids to participate.

Officials Status As of this writing, there are more than 80 officials who have let their official's certification lapse due to non-three-way compliance, not completing the rules review, non- interest, etc. I encourage all of you who love our sport to maintain your 3-way compliance by undergoing the Safesport refresher course, the NCSISafe background check and maintaining your membership in USATF.

**Safety:** I'm sure you heard or read about the official being killed by a flying implement in Colorado earlier this season as well as near misses. All of us at one time or another have witnessed accidents or near misses happening at a meet. A lot of this could have been avoided by just BEING AWARE OF YOUR SURROUNDINGS at a meet and BEING PROACTIVE IN REDUCING POTENTIAL RISKS. As part of this, the NOC Training Chair, Scott Phoenix, held a course on track and field safety. In it, he highlighted the safety portion in the USATF Officials

The Dick Connors Meritorious Service Award: Recipient must have ten (10) years of experience as a Track & Field Official AND must be certified as Masters level official with the USATF. This award is not required to be awarded every year.

George Newlon Special Recognition Award: Recipient should normally have seven (7) years of experience as a Track & Field Official AND be certified as either National or Master level official with the USATF. This award is primarily for achievement in the area of Track event officiating. This award is not required to be awarded every year.

**Dick Barbour Special Recognition Award**: Recipient should normally have seven (7) years of experience as a Track & Field Official AND be certified as either National or Master level official with the USATF. This award is primarily for achievement in the area of Field event officiating. This award is not required to be awarded every year.

Horace Crow Special Recognition Award: Recipient should normally have seven (7) years of experience as a Track & Field Official AND be certified as either National or Master level official with the USATF. This award is primarily for achievement in the area of Field event officiating. This award is not required to be awarded every year.

Lori & Sonny Maynard Special Recognition Award: Recipient must be a person involved, other than as a spectator, in Track & Field, LDR, or Race Walking in any capacity AND has exhibited exceptional dedication to the sport of Track & Field, LDR or Race Walking. This award is not required to be awarded every year.

#### **IN MEMORIAM- Leroy Milam**



**Leroy James Milam**, age 83, of Castro Valley, passed away in the hospital on March 13, 2025, after fighting a courageous six-month battle with cancer.

Leroy was born on May 15, 1941, to James and Mary Milam in Redwood City, California. He graduated from Sequoia High School in 1959, and soon after graduation, Leroy enlisted in the United State Marines and served his county from 1960 - 1965. Leroy was an active member of the Castro Valley VFW.

Following his military service, Leroy dedicated 38 years to the Safeway Beverage Plant in Richmond, California. His younger brother Richard Milam recruited Leroy to be a track official for track meets in California and Texas. This became a new interest and ultimately was a fulltime activity that Leroy enjoyed until he found out he had cancer. Leroy was always active and never met a stranger. He was a Boy Scout Master and a Camp Master for many years. He enjoyed NASCAR, driving sprint cars, and working on race cars with many of his friends. Leroy attended many softball, soccer, and baseball events for both Darlene and Daniel.

Leroy is survived by his wife of 55 years, Catherine (nee Scott) Milam, and their children Darlene Milam of Castro Valley and Daniel (Danielle) Milam of Jacksonville, Florida, along with his four children from his first marriage to Doris McElwee, D.J. (Patricia) Milam of Paris, Texas, Debbie Milam Hartman of Cedar Park, Texas, Jeff Milam of Sherman, Texas, and Victoria Milam Ayres of Cedar Park, Texas. Leroy is further survived by 5 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren.

He is preceded in death by his parents James and Mary Milam and his brother, Richard Milam.

Calling All LDR Officials:

The 2025 USATF Pacific Road Grand Prix Season kicks off with the first race on March 1st. Please support our PA Grand Prix Road events by working one or more. The commitment is relatively short (compared to some Track & Field meets) and you'll usually be off to the rest of your day well before noon. For most races we need a referee, starter, and a finish crew. For bigger races, we add clerks, umpires, and marshals.

New to LDR? You can start by working one or more of the races in the Road (and starting in August, the XC) PA Grand Prix series. We'll pair you with other officials to get you started.

### **Certification Chair's Report**

• Remember to stay 3-way compliant; It is necessary for keeping certification valid: Is your USATF membership current? Please check on your USATF connect (sport80) profile and renew if necessary. If you did not have an auto-renewal or multi-year USATF membership and did not renew the membership, it has expired at the end of 2023. To stay 3-way compliant, the membership needs to be renewed. Start at the USATF connect (Sport80) profile page membership tab. The other 2 aspects of the 3-way compliance are the Safesport training and background check. If you are not 3-way compliant, your certification is not valid. For many of us who first started with the current Safesport training curriculum introduced back in 2019, we are due for the full core training instead of the 3 refreshers. This core training can take up to 4 hours. Be prepared to set aside that time.

#### · All certifications expired at the end of 2024

 Recertification for the year 2025-2028 will require 3-way compliance, recertification application and rules review/s

#### • 3-way compliance:

- Keep up your SafeSport and Background check, to reduce work for the recertification
- o Membership renewal is the 3<sup>rd</sup> part of 3-way compliance:
- o If seeking 1 year membership, do it after Nov.1, 2024. If seeking multi-year membership, wait until Jan.1, 2025.

#### Recertification application:

o The application has been simplified to ask basic information (duplication vs the sport80 database has been mostly eliminated)

and get confirmation on the acceptance of the official's code of ethics and the performance guidelines.

#### • Rules reviews:

- o Expected to be available by November 1. We plan to have some zoom clinics during Nov-Dec to go through the process so you can do it on your own. For those wishing in person help, we plan some clinics in Jan-Feb so you can do it on paper and submit it in person.
- o If you were certified in 2024, no rules reviews for you
- o Most of the rest of you (all apprentices and most association level officials) will only take the Basic review (75Q –True/False, Fill in the blanks, multiple choice)
- o National/Master level officials will also need to take Advanced review (for the essay style 5 for Nat, 8 for Master)
- Specialty reviews Implement Inspectors, Race Walk, Referee, LDR referee, CEC, Para
  - o We have between 5-30 officials in these specialty categories
- o If you are interested in leading the rules review discussions, please contact me.

There have been past a lot of rule changes for USATF, NCAA and NFHS for this year. Please REVIEW ALL OF YOUR RULE BOOKS (Especially the applicable rulebook for the level of competition you are doing)

**ORDER THE LATEST RULE BOOKS!!!** Don't leave home without the correct book for the meet you are doing! Books, Downloads, Changes, Interpretations, Discussions, Indexes. Make sure you have the current rule books for the upcoming 2025 season: **NFHS, NCAA, USATF, World Athletics, and Para Athletics**. Follow the links below to order, download, or view a rule book.

**USATF: USATF Rule Book**--view or download. Hard copies of the USATF Competition Rules will be available for sale in February on the Team USA online store under the category "Accessories." USATF Certified Officials receive a 50% discount using code: 24OFFICIALS. View this rules changes presentation and the rule changes scorecard.
